

is used to show agreement with positive statements.

SO + Auxiliary + Subject (pronoun)

The Auxiliary needs to agree with the verb tense in the original statement.

It is similar to using

INSITHER

is used to show agreement with negative statements.

Neither + Auxiliary + Subject (pronoun)

The Auxiliary needs to agree with the verb tense in the original statement.

It is similar to using **EUUTIEN** at the end of a sentence, although **Neither** is more commonly used, especially in spoken English.

Neither + Auxiliar + Subject Subject + Auxiliar (NOT) + Either

I don't like cats. Neither does Mary. Mary doesn't either. I didn't like cats. Neither did Mary. Mary didn't either.

ullet Me too and me neither are often used informal spoken English.

Examples:

- 1. A: I'm hungry.
- B: Me too. (informal)
- 2. A: I don't eat meat.
- B: Me neither, (informal)
